

Submission of "Document on Primary Environmental Impact Consideration for Offshore Wind Power Project off the coast of Shimamaki, Hokkaido (tentative name) "

January 14, 2025 The Kansai Electric Power Co., Inc.

The Kansai Electric Power Co., Inc. (hereinafter, "KEPCO") and RWE Renewables Japan G.K. (hereinafter, RWE) today submitted the Documents on Primary Environmental Impact Consideration (hereinafter, Documents) for the Offshore Wind Power Project off the coast of Shimamaki, Hokkaido to the Minister of Economy, Trade and Industry and requested the Governor of Hokkaido to provide his opinion in accordance with the Environmental Impact Assessment Law.

The Documents will be made public from January 15 to February 14 of this year at relevant administrative agencies and on the KEPCO's website.

KEPCO and RWE will continue to study the feasibility of implementing the project, giving due consideration to environmental preservation, after receiving opinions from local residents and relevant government agencies.

KEPCO Group is committed to the expansion of renewable energy, with a target of 5 GW scale of new development and 9 GW scale of cumulative capacity by 2040 domestically, thereby contributing to the realization of a zero-carbon society.


